Behind the creation of our garden

Lynn Cordall is a garden designer based in South Manchester. Lynn decided to follow her growing passion for gardens after a long and fulfilling career in the fashion industry, establishing her own studio in 2020. Since then, Lynn has achieved two gold medals for her show gardens, one being Best in Show at RHS Tatton Park Flower Show 2022.

“Gardens enhance people’s lives, providing a space to sit, reflect, celebrate, laugh, chat, be alone, be with friends or even escape. The garden will live on after the show at community spaces with Knutsford Council, helping people for a long time to come.”

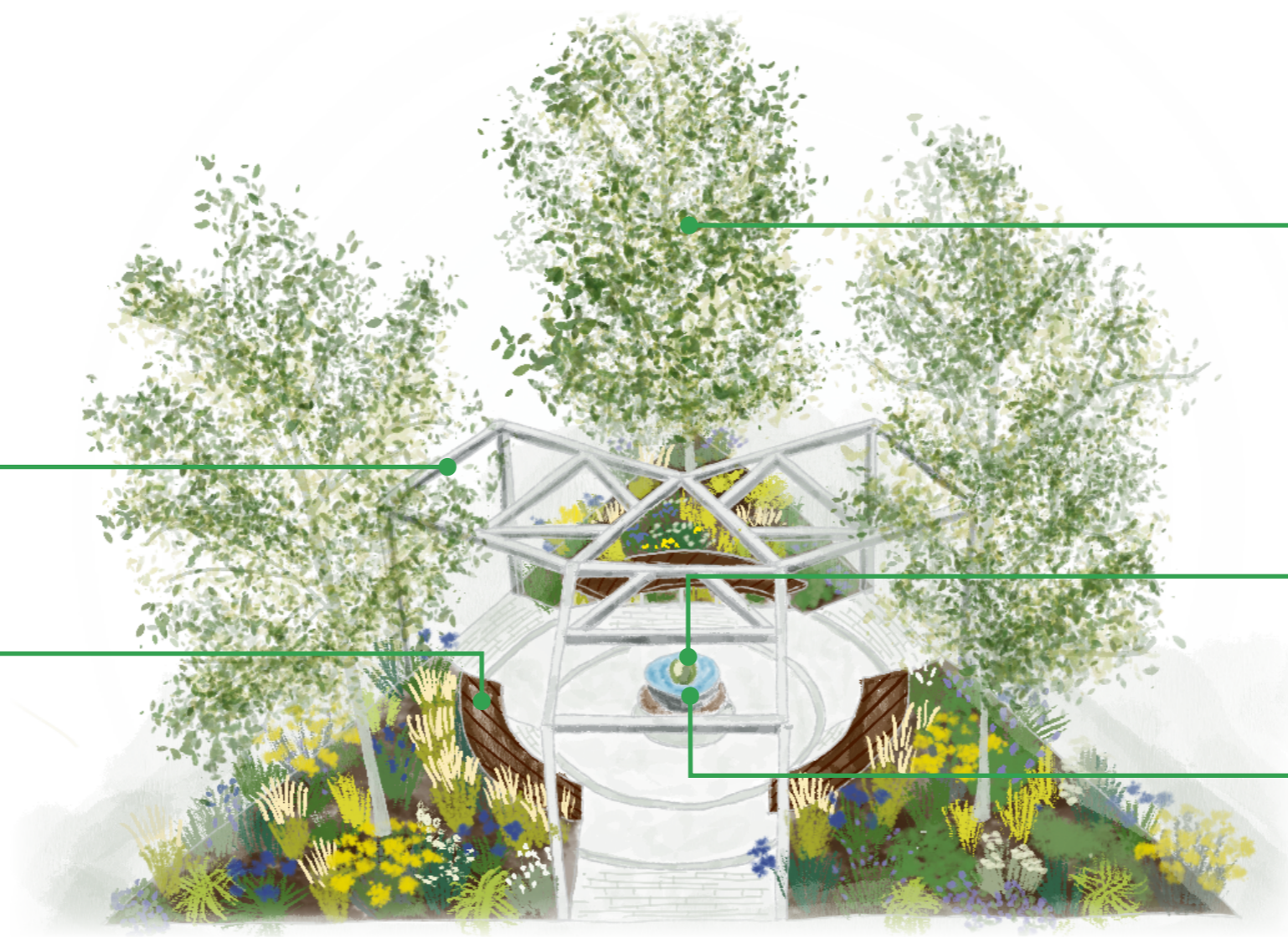

Welcome to the Macmillan Legacy Garden

With three entrances and three sides to view, the garden can be accessed and enjoyed by anyone. Just like leaving a gift in your will to Macmillan is for anyone, regardless of age, income or situation.

Wooden benches form a circle of comfortable seating inside the garden, enabling supporters to sit and contemplate the future and the impact of gifts in wills for Macmillan.



The three trees, three benches and three entrances represent that over a third of Macmillan's services are funded by gifts in wills. Having trees of differing height, meaning they are of different ages, highlights that leaving a gift is something we can all do at any age.

Gifts in wills are a seed for the future, that can grow into a lasting legacy – the sapling Betula tree in the centre of the garden highlights this. Trees are essential for supporting life, just like gifts in wills are essential to ensure that Macmillan can continue to support people affected by cancer in the future.

A spectacular water feature wraps around the sapling Betula tree, emphasising the importance of each gift left to Macmillan.

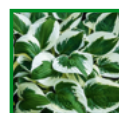
