








Introduction

Almost 3.5 million people in the UK are living with cancer. This is the highest figure ever reported for the UK. That's millions of lives turned upside down, every day, in so many ways. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

National Cancer CNS Day

What is a Cancer Clinical Nurse Specialist?

Nearly 3.5 million people will be living with cancer in the UK this year, the highest number ever recorded in the UK. Cancer Clinical Nurse Specialists are experts in their field, offering a unique blend of skills to provide quality care to patients throughout the cancer experience. They are pivotal in the coordination and delivery of personalised care interventions and offer support physically and emotionally.

Cancer clinical nurse specialists are highly regarded because of their specialist training and education and for choosing to work in an extremely demanding and complex field of healthcare.

What is National Cancer CNS Day?

The idea for a national cancer CNS day was born out of the knowledge that the growth of the cancer workforce is not keeping pace with the increasing demand for cancer services.

The National Cancer Workforce Plan (2017) and NHS England's People Plan (2020) both pledged to increase and transform the cancer workforce to support the delivery of 21st century care. Raising awareness at this time is vital to promote action. We know the Cancer CNS workforce is aging with 18% of the workforce who are older than the average age of general nursing personnel. Furthermore, since 30% of CNSs are looking to retire in the next 8 years, campaigns such as the National Cancer CNS Day are both important and urgent.

The Aspiring Cancer Career Education Development programme (ACCEND) was established to address and provide solutions to key issues that challenge the cancer workforce both now and into the future.

When is National Cancer CNS Day?

National Cancer CNS Day campaign will run on 14th March.

Who can get involved in National Cancer CNS Day?

Everyone – if you have social media, feel free to join in ensuring you use the hashtag #NationalCancerCNSDay.

To help this awareness day continue to grow, we would like to encourage all organisations to support their cancer nurses and colleagues to engage and celebrate the work our cancer CNSs do and the significant impact they have on cancer patient outcomes.

Where is National Cancer CNS Day hosted?

This is a social media awareness campaign; therefore, activity will take place on social media platforms such as X (formerly known as twitter), Facebook, LinkedIn and Instagram. By coming together on social media, we can reach a larger, diverse audience and everyone has the opportunity to engage with the activity from wherever they are located. It also allows people to share stories, pictures, and videos to raise awareness of this vital role but to also showcase the great work of our cancer CNS workforce. It also allows people to share and show their support of the workforce.

Some organisations, alliances and teams have celebrated by organising local events such as away days, well-being events and celebratory stalls to show their appreciation to the cancer CNS workforce. How can we get involved?

The overarching focus of cancer CNS day is for it to be an awareness raising social media campaign, so please use the messaging and posts in in this pack and join in with the scheduled thunderclap moments at 9am and 1pm.

Is there any funding available to support with content and in person events?

What is a thunderclap moment?

A thunderclap moment is a scheduled burst of activity that happens in support of a campaign. Essentially, everyone shares a social media post on their chosen/preferred platform, at the same time, so there's a sudden surge in awareness (a thunderclap if you will) and the hashtags trend. CNS Day on the 14th March shines a light on the wonderful work of cancer clinical nurse specialists (CNS) helping to support patients far and wide.

Years of evaluating the role has firmly established the CNS as an essential member of the multidisciplinary team in enhancing cancer care. CNSs use their expertise to assess, diagnose and treat people living with cancer and their role extends to other areas such as education and research

Responsibilities includes holistic support, specialist advice, symptom control and signposting to other services. CNS support can ensure people have continuity of care during their cancer journey as CNSs are usually the first point of contact when a patient requires any support and they continue to be involved in their care for many years.
